This year marks the 499th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation which started when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany, on Oct. 31, 1517. We Lutherans celebrate Reformation on the last Sunday of October, which is October 30th this year. Remember to wear red, which is the liturgical color of the day.

Martin Luther believed that he was recovering the centrality of Scripture within the Christian tradition. His main dispute with the Roman Catholic Church (he was an Augustinian monk) was primarily related to abuses by the clergy, especially related to the selling of indulgences. (An indulgence was something one would buy to forgive their sins.) Luther said, "The Church's true treasure is the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

The Protestant doctrine of justification by faith alone and the priesthood of all believers are two critical beliefs that shaped the birth of Protestantism and powerfully changed the trajectory of Western Civilization. Many of the modern ideas of Democracy grew out of the priesthood of all believers, sola scriptura, and Presbyterian form of church government. Luther "did more than any single man to make modern history the development of revolution," declared the 19th century English historian Lord Acton.

Luther did not initially mean to separate from the Roman Catholic Church but was only asking for reforms on the proper interpretation of Scripture, especially on the idea of repentance. The very first of his listed 95 Theses reads: "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance."

Some Roman Catholic leaders were selling indulgences promising that past and future sins would be forgiven. A common refrain from the time attributed to Catholic clergyman Johann Tetzel was "As soon as a coin in the coffer rings a soul from purgatory springs." Luther, of course, contested the idea that salvation, forgiveness, and repentance could be bought and sold.
