They shall take away the ashes from the altar, and spread a purple cloth over it; Numbers 4:13

Who knew that the color purple was associated with ashes from the earliest days of Judaism? It is in ashes that we begin our Lenten journey. On Ash Wednesday we are marked with ashes and hear these words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." I often recall those times when I have felt like the words of that old spiritual, *sometimes I feel like a motherless child, a long way from home.*

In Lent we dress the church in the color purple. Purple is used for two reasons: firstly because it is associated with mourning and so anticipates the pain and suffering of the crucifixion, and secondly because purple is the color associated with royalty, and celebrates Christ's resurrection and sovereignty.

Our midweek Lenten services this year will focus on simple everyday objects. These ideas came from the book *Lent in Plain Sight* by Jill Duffield. Each week we will think about things like: dust and ashes, bread, the cross, coins, shoes, oil, towels, and thorns. Easter Sunday is the conclusion of this journey and we will be talking about...stones!

Please come at 11:30 am or 7pm each Wednesday of Lent. The 11:30 service ends with soup at noonish. The 7pm service begins with soup at 6pm. The soup is always great and the conversation is even better than the soup!

The month of March also marks our month of the Capital Campaign. Phyllis Wiederhoeft will be here on March 1 to kick us off as she preaches and prepares us. She will be here to conclude our Capital Campaign on Palm Sunday, April 5. I hope you are in prayer already for those women and men who have agreed to help with this campaign. And, I hope you are in prayer as a family as to what you will be giving to make this campaign successful for the future of our congregation!

God is in the blessing business! We will be blessed because of your incredible generosity! I am so proud of us – we are the 3rd most generous congregation in the whole synod – I have the statistics to prove it from the synod treasurer, Mike Metzger.
