Preschool News

Our "Sense-Sational" summer session was lots of fun! Our last day of summer session was on Friday, 8/20. We celebrated with an obstacle course bounce house on the playground. We closed 8/23-8/27 for our staff work week to get everything cleaned and prepped for fall. Our staff also attended workshops on phonics and literacy, sign language for babies, and conscious discipline during work week.

We were able to raise enough through our fundraising efforts to have new floors installed on campus the last week of Summer. We now have vinyl wood plank flooring in all of the preschool classrooms. They are beautiful and we are so happy that we were able to invest in this upgrade.

We are so grateful to the church for allowing us to borrow the adult lounge to use as our "Raccoon Room" classroom as we navigated through COVID last school year . Since we will no longer need to use the adult lounge as a classroom, we painted the room and replaced the carpet in that space with the same vinyl wood plank flooring.

Our 2021-2022 school year began on August 30th with full enrollment in all rooms. We have been able to make some adjustments to our COVID policies as the guidelines change. Parents are now able to drop off on campus, at their child's classroom door. We were also able to go back to our normal operating hours of 7am-6pm for the new school year. Children and staff still must wear masks indoors, regardless of vaccination status but can be mask less outdoors on the playground.

Our staffing for fall will be Mrs. Caston in Room 1, Mrs. Leone and Ms. Janssen-Nielson in Room 2, Mrs. Skinner and Mrs. Griffith in Room 3, Ms. Fitzpatrick in Room 4, Mrs. Stiles in Room 5, Ms. Yang in Room 6, Ms. Saeed as our Afternoon Teacher, Ms. Scott as our AM Floater, Mrs. Palley and Ms. Chhim for our PM teachers. Ms. Laney will be moving to a sub basis. Ms. Theriault will continue as the Assistant Director. We have 28 new families joining our CLP family this year. We will spend the month getting to know all of our new families and getting to know our current families even better. We are planning to host our first, on campus, school wide event, *Back to School Night*, on Monday, 9/13. This will be a parents only event.

We wish success to all of our graduates going to Kindergarten and look forward to welcoming our new and continuing students to another year of *Growing in God's Love at CLP*.
