## Do you really know your PRE Fund?

If you have ever attended a congregational meeting, you probably heard the treasurer talk about the PRE Fund. You might have also seen it on your pledge cards or giving envelopes. As your current treasurer, I believe it's very important for you to know what it is and how it's going.

First of all, PRE stands for Property Repair & Enhancement. It is separate from the General Fund (which covers payroll, utilities, supplies, insurances, licenses, programs – basically the operating budget of the church). PRE covers the recurring services like gardeners, janitorial, preventative maintenance. It is also our "rainy day fund" (sometimes quite literally) to cover the equally important brick and mortar projects like roofing, painting, plumbing, electrical and general repairs. The projects can be large or small and I can guarantee we will *always* have them. Given that, we need to be financially prepared to handle them when they arise. There is a lot of room for improvement here.

Last year, the PRE fund was in significant debt. Over the years, we had to borrow from the Endowment fund to pay for mold remediation, roof repair on the sanctuary, LED lighting retrofit, electrical gear and emergency repairs. It got to the point where there wasn't a way to pay it all back. In October of last year, Council voted to forgive the loan PRE had with Endowment. PRE ended October with a clean slate. Since then, however, we have really had a lot of rainy days. The storms caused a significant amount of damage to the robing room and Columbarium. These repairs and others have driven the PRE Fund into the red again, (\$8,689) at the end of May.

I implore you to prayerfully consider giving a little extra to the PRE fund both now and when we start our pledge drive later this year. It's important to have funds available for those rainy days.
