And this just floored me. It was such a simple melody, but had a deeply profound message. It was enough to make me stop in my tracks for a second. What a beautiful message to share with these young ones about what it means to be


community, particularly in the body of Christ. Being God's people is about being together- in worship, in fellowship, in community, in service- but also in prayer. We do this as we strive to emulate Jesus' Emmanuel, "God with us," by being with one another.

On my first Sunday at Christ Lutheran, I was surprised by the prayers of the church. Not surprised that they were included, but rather the length of time you spent dedicated to this practice. It was and is more so than I've seen in previous places I've worshipped or served, and it has prompted me to pay attention. What exactly are we praying for? And for whom are we praying? What significance does it hold in our worship life together?

Did you know? The prayers for each Sunday are made available through a church resource called Sundays and Seasons. Churches across the ELCA that use this resource are lifting up the same prayers each week, no matter their location. In this way, our prayers are magnified.

Did you know? Our prayers are edited and adapted for our congregation by church

member, Rich Oelschlaeger. He has been preparing our prayers weekly as a volunteer for 10+ years! Rich incorporates the names of those on our prayer chain, whether church family or loved ones that are dealing with illness, are homebound or in care facilities, as well as those who are serving as first responders, in the peace and diplomatic corps and in our nation's military. In addition, Rich adds a prayer for Linda Gawthorne, our partner in ministry serving as a missionary working with the Kogi people in Colombia.



<u>Did you know?</u> We offer special prayers once a month for leaders and organizations to which we are affiliated and working in collaboration and support. They are scheduled as follows:

1st week

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, Bishop Brenda Bos, Pastors, Deacons, and elected leaders of our church.

2nd week

Christ Lutheran Preschool, our Lutheran universities and seminaries and all schools of our church.

3rd week

Lutheran Social Services, Christian Outreach in Action, New Life Beginning.

4th week

Congregations of the Greater Long Beach Conference.

5th week

Lutheran Maritime Ministries, Habitat 4 Humanity, California Lutheran Homes.

With all those things to pray for, no wonder that this takes a few minutes.

I heard a church member recall once that a visitor commented on the practice observed here and that they saw that as a mark of folks taking Christianity seriously-willing to spend time doing something important.

And what a thing to be known for! And we are certainly richer for it.



The Assisting Minister follows a script, which most often includes the recital of the Apostles' or Nicene Creed, reading the prayers of the church, and serving communion. It is also the Assisting Minister who dismisses the congregation at the end of worship by calling out "Go in peace and serve the Lord" or another similar phrase. Altar Guild

The Altar Guild helps prepare the Sanctuary for worship services, weddings, funerals, baptisms, and Holy Communion, and helps decorate the sanctuary for the many different church seasons. Additionally, the Altar Guild members care for the altar and its furnishings and linens and perform any other necessary duties to prepare the sanctuary for worship.


