Our own longtime CLC member, Karen Wyrick, was recently honored by the Long Beach Senior Citizen Advisory Commission for her years of work as an advocate and counselor for PFLAG (Parents, family and friends of lesbians and gays). About 26 years ago, when Pastor Wally Berton served us here at Christ Lutheran, Karen helped form the first PFLAG chapter in Long Beach to help confused and distressed gays and lesbians and their families and friends, cope with their situation. They held their monthly meetings at CLC for a long time until moving to a downtown location.

Karen served as President of PFLAG for over 17 years until finally stepping down to currently serve as Vice President. She further served in many other roles, such as moderator at local meetings, which is an extremely sensitive role, because she must gently guide everyone involved through personal discussions and yet place a heightened awareness and acceptance of the LGBTQ community. Karen remains as the chapter's point-of-contact in the greater Long Beach area and has spent countless hours counseling gays, lesbians, and their distressed parents, family members and friends through their own coming out process. She served on PFLAG's Speakers Bureau, an outreach part of the larger PFLAG organization, that helps provide dialogue about the LGBTQ community. In spite of advancing age and health issues, she remains involved in many other aspects of LGBTQ activities and can be seen each year riding in the Long Beach Pride Parade.

Karen has done all of these things while being a single mother, raising her two boys here at CLC, volunteering for other church duties, and having a full time career as Executive Director of the Rotary Club of L.B. for 33 years until her 2012 retirement. Oh yes, she was also Executive Secretary of the American Cancer Society for 8 years.

We at CLC are grateful for Karen's truly Christ-like attitude and work. We are thankful for her membership and influence here, and applaud her for this special well deserved recognition.

News from Linda and the Kogi people


As Bible translators our dream as well as goal is not only to translate God's Word into the language of the people group God called us to serve, but to see it in use by those who speak this language. What a joy it was to see with my own eyes, while I was in the Kogi area a month ago, that the Kogis are using God's Word both in written and in audio format.



Nearly all of the Kogis show up early for church services. While they sit and wait they open their New Testaments to read the Word. When reading to themselves Kogis tend to read softly out loud – wow to hear many gathered around reading certainly thrilled this Bible translator! Several are also beginning to underline or

highlight passages. While visiting one family I was concerned that the New Testament had already lost its cover. When I commented about it the

husband told me it was the copy he took to the farm with him to read when he took a break which is why it is so beat up. It was a joy to see many New Testaments looking a bit "beat up" from use during the 15 months since they received them[©]



Even readers like to have the N.T. available in audio format to listen to as they walk long hours on the trail or while they work. The Kogis would love to have Christian music available as well so we are working on how to make that happen. For those who have cell phones they will soon have the Kogi N.T. available to use on their phones as well.

On Easter morning I slipped in the back door of the church while the worship team and those participating in the service were busy preparing. It thrilled me to see them using the New Testament as they prepared to lead the service. Those who were not practicing

at that moment were sitting around reading the Word. One father told me how his seven year old son, Ruben, reads and reads the New Testament. If he doesn't understand a difficult concept he asks his father about it. Ruben read me a passage from Galatians and I was amazed not only at how well he could read it as Kogi words are long, but that he was able to answer when I asked him about what he had understood from it. This is a link to him reading Galatians 1.6-9 in Kogi:

On a personal note. On April 11, I was dismayed to learn that there was an increase in the amount of fluid under my left retina caused by "wet" macular degeneration which necessitated an urgent shot into that eye. It seems this is the worst my eye has been in the 15 months since I began needing the intraocular injections. I must now again have injections every 4 weeks rather than every 6 weeks. I would appreciate you joining me in prayer that my eyes will stabilize and improve.

Rejoice with us at how the Kogi New Testament is being using by Kogi believers, and also please pray with us that its use will spread to the widely separated Kogi villages in the mountains and the Kogis who live there who have not yet heard a clear presentation of the gospel message. We are thrilled that the audio New Testament is being listened to in several of these villages. Pray that the listeners will understand the message of God's Word and be drawn to Jesus,

The Story of the Woven Image Sewing Institute Provided by Carole and Tom Parmeter-Dyer

The offering money collected during the Woven Image concerts held here at Christ Lutheran and at other local churches goes to a very special group of women and children in Hyderabad, India. We became connected with these people through Reverend Doctor Victor Luther Nakka, a Lutheran pastor from India who came to Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in 1997 as a research scholar for one year. Carole was studying for her Master of Divinity degree at the same time and both Victor and Carole lived in the school dormitory.

When Victor returned home to his wife Jansey and their three children, he wrote to Carole and Tom about the plight of the people living in the slum of Lenin Nagar who made up his parish. The women and men are from the dalit (untouchable) caste and suffer from extreme poverty and malnutrition. The men work in the rock quarries and suffer from t.b., ulcers and other diseases. Victor urged us to use our gifts to help his people, reminding us of our calling as followers of Jesus to help those in need.

The Woven Image Sewing Center was established in 1998. With only four hundred dollars, five sewing machines were purchased along with materials for teaching. In 1999, more money was sent; teacher's salaries were paid, and a school was started for the children. We have sent money every year since, and a health clinic and nurse training program were added in 2005. In 2009, two more sewing centers were added, and in 2010 a school principal and a second pastor were hired! This is truly a sign of the presence of the Holy Spirit among us! The objective of the Woven Image Sewing Institute is to train the women of Pastor Nakka's parish so that they can become self-reliant and empowered. We thank you for your generous gifts and ask that you keep the women, children and men of Pastor Nakka's parish in your prayers. It is amazing what we can do together, with the Holy Spirit.

Pastor Nakka writes, "You are our refuge, strength and source of help. I feel the burden for all those who are working at the Institute. Women are empowered because of you and your team. Your talents and your voices have the power of giving life for people who lack resources and opportunities to stand on their own. These life-giving efforts have no substitute. Christ's blessings to you all."

Reverend Doctor Nakka passed away on April 15th in India. We are deeply saddened by this news, and will continue to support the women and children of this parish in the coming years. Our former percussionist, Alan Cook, had this to say about our dear friend Victor: "Pastor Victor was a dear man, a lover of life and all people, who shone a great light that guided and inspired so many to live a better life. He was the distant director of the group known as Woven Image, its heart and its purpose reflected his own. I am grateful for all that has grown from the seeds he has sown.


