This Lent, we have walked our way through the passion story, according to John. Each week we have spent our time on a part of the Holy Week events, thinking about Jesus and how all of this fits into our life today. The things Jesus said and did in John's telling of his life are some of the best known scriptures in our popular culture.

As the events of Holy Week unfold, we are prepared to see the life, death and resurrection of Jesus in a different light because of the time we have spent in Lent moving toward this week that makes Christians, Christians. Why is this so important? Our popular culture knows less about the Bible than in recent history. WE need to know, understand, and be able to articulate what it is we believe...and why. Not for the sake of arguing, but for deep conversation with people who are hurting, or hungry for a word of hope, or ready for something that truly satisfies.

And, dear friends, those people are all around us! After falling in February, I

thought a lot about how I greeted people coming down the mountain while in pain. Almost every person I met going up, I smiled at and greeted with, "Good morning, how ya doin'?" (I was in the Smoky Mountains in Tennessee) My reply to that question was always, "Fine." Why did I do that, I've often asked myself. Was it embarrassment, fear, a need to save face? Did those people coming up really need to know my pain? Of course not, it was a casual and standard greeting of American polite society.

Not all of our relationships are this casual. We have co-workers, classmates, friends and relatives that we can (and possibly should?) speak resurrection hope to when things are going well – and when things are going not-so-well. Through the eons, Jesus still calls us by name, just like Jesus did to Mary on Easter morning. Jesus knows us – the deepest and most hidden parts of us - and loves ALL of us. His abiding presence in our lives gently moves us to know more and more about our faith and how it interacts in our daily lives.

It's Easter...hope, joy, peace, and love are ours...can I hear a Halleluiah?!?


