





Read these six tips to help you become a cyber-security expert:

- Create strong passwords and make sure your password is long. Substitute letters with numbers, punctuation marks, or symbols, or use a phrase for your password. Remember, length is much better than complexity when creating a strong passphrase.
- 2. **Never provide personal or confidential information** in response to an email, call, or text. Instead, call the individual directly using contact information you have on file.
- 3. **If you connect it, protect it.** Any device that connects to the internet is vulnerable to risk. The best defense is to keep device security software, web browser, and operating systems up-to-date.
- 4. Use Two-Step Authentication as a second layer of security for validating your identity when logging into online accounts (if the security feature is offered). This can be done through an authenticator app or a numeric code provided via text message, phone call, or email.
- 5. Do not allow all mobile apps to track your location and access your private information. Configure the privacy and security settings by app and help someone in your community do the same. Enable automatic updates so that your software runs smoothly and you stay protected against cyber threats.
- 6. **Beware of what you share.** Cyber criminals love it when you overshare on social media; they can learn all about you and your loved ones. Make it harder for them by avoiding posting real names, places you frequent, and home, school and work locations.
