Message from the president of Red Cross Biomed Services:

The frightening truth? Our blood supply is at a historic low.

The Red Cross is experiencing the worst blood shortage in over a decade, and patient care is being affected right now. A dangerously low blood supply means we have had to reduce the amount of blood products hospitals receive by as much as 25% in recent weeks, forcing hospitals to defer patient surgeries, including organ transplants. Hospital demand remains strong, but fewer donors are coming in – perhaps because of the holiday season, vacation travel, or regular activities having resumed.


