The Sunday after Thanksgiving (November 27) is the first Sunday in the season of Advent! This season can be an occasion for a new start as we begin a new liturgical year in the life of the church. While the world around us winds down the calendar year, and readies for the excitement of Christmas, we return to a place that is bare and raw. We wait for God to show up again in the nakedness of a newborn in a simple stable. We wait for Christ to come again for bring to fruition all things.

Advent is the season of waiting. Not necessarily with the same excitement of Christmas, but with an eagerness born of longing; with the anticipation of God's entrance into our lives. 
donations totaling \$281.92 from just 13 households so far this year.
