February 2023 is a month of transitions in the community of faith at Christ Lutheran. At the Congregational Meeting on January 22, new Church Council officers and members were elected. We give thanks for those who have served in various leadership positions through the return to in-person worship and staffing changes of the past 12 months. And we look forward to the talents that new leaders bring to invigorate our message of God's love to the world.

At the end of the month, we transition from the season of Epiphany to the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday (February 22nd) marks the beginning of the 40 days of our Lenten journey. Traditionally a time of preparation for baptism, we will offer Holy Communion and Baptism preparation sessions after worship each Sunday in March (March 5, 12, 19 & 26). Our worship takes a more subdued tone as we "Bury the Alleluia" and prepare ourselves for the joy of the Easter celebration. (Easter is April 9th!!)

Recipe for (Chicken) Tortilla Soup

Shared by Kim Croes, originally made by Jenn Ostergren for confirmation dinners.

Ingredients

Meat (Your preference or none for vegetarian version)

- 1 12.5-oz can Chicken breast
- 1-1.5 lb. shredded/ground beef

Canned Goods (Again your preference, but I use the following, can substitute low sodium where available)

- 1 15-oz can Kidney beans, red
- 1 15-oz can Pinto beans
- 1-15-oz can black beans
- 1 14.5-oz can diced tomatoes with garlic
- 1-15 oz can cream of chicken soup (for thickening, don't use if you want a vegetarian version)
- 1 small can green chilis
- 1 box of chicken or vegetable broth

Other items

- 1bag frozen corn
- Taco Seasoning(several packets or a jar)
- 1 bunch cilantro for garnish
- Chopped avocado for garnish
- Sour cream for garnish
- Shredded Mexican mix cheese for garnish
- Tortilla chips

Preparation

Empty all canned goods, including the liquid, into large pot. Heat through, add the bag of frozen corn.

Add taco seasoning to taste; start with a quarter cup or 2 packets. As the seasoning mixes in, continue to taste, adding as you prefer. At this time you may want to add 13oz of water to increase volume of soup.

Let everything simmer on low for 20 minutes. (I like to make this ahead and let the flavors really meld together.)

Prepare your bowls for serving: place crushed tortilla chips in bowl, top with cheese if desired. Ladle soup into bowl and garnish with any or all of the suggested items, or anything you might prefer. This is not a spicy version so you may want to add your favorite heat increasers.


