### Dear Friends in Christ,

Several years ago, our former Southwest California Synodical Bishop, Dr. R. Guy Erwin, wrote, "Our faith is death-defying: it takes death seriously and faces it unflinchingly." This really resonates through the season of Lent. Lent is the season of the church year where we immerse our whole selves in the ultimate reality of our human death and all the other "little deaths" around us. But this season is also a time when we cannot shed the reality of the resurrected life we are living – right here, right now. Jesus' experience of life, death, and resurrection is always with us. And sometimes it seems we focus mostly on Jesus' life and celebrate His resurrection. During the season of Lent, we focus closer on Jesus' death and the impact that has on our faith and our lives. As Lutherans, we do not turn away from death or loss in any form – even when it is uncomfortable to face or acknowledge.

In Sunday morning worship during this Lenten season, together we will publicly confess to God; "we confess to you our faults and failings. Too often we neglect and do not trust your holy word; we take for ourselves instead of giving to others; we spoil rather than steward your creation; we cause hurt though you call us to heal; we chose fear over compassion." (Sundays and Seasons, 2022-23, p. 104) How often we act or re-act out of anxiety and dread because of what is going on in the world today? How often we forget or ignore how God has acted in the past, and think we must be able to do it better? Let us recognize those dark places in our lives this Lenten season. Let us take the "little deaths" seriously, whether it be a grief, a loss or just facing our own limitations. Now is that time.

Sometimes "change" in the life of a faith community, like that of an interim time between permanent pastors, can feel like a "little death". Whether it be grief over a beloved former pastor, or anxiety about what will happen to "my church", or a difference in the way things have always been done – that adjustment period can be hard. That is why we take this time seriously and do not shy away from the work necessary to move forward. I have been so encouraged by those of you who have stepped forward in courage and hope to participate in the good (and hard) work necessary to call a permanent pastor to Christ Lutheran Church. I am also inspired by those you have come forward to fill the needs of the church – worship, outreach, administration, stewardship, connection. What a terrific witness to the assurance that God has not abandoned us! What a wonderful reminder of God's promise to be with us on our journey! (Continued on next page.)

I encourage all of us to look for ways we can practice our faith in God in "death-defying" ways. If we open our eyes and ears and hearts and hands trusting in the promise of God through Jesus Christ, we move forward not in fear, but in hope. Let it be so.

February flew by! We had a wonderful Special Person Day where just about every


child had a Special Person! For Valentine's Day, the




