Would you believe that it's the only Christian football waltz known to date? It is a treat and definitely worth a look up on YouTube! I heard this song for the first time on a drive Up North with my Dad and couldn't believe the lyrics nor the tune. However, the more I listen to it, the more I realize the wonderful message hidden in this catchy, quirky tune.

Most folks would say that kickers and punters are the least-respected members of a football team. Maybe it's because they are some of the smaller players. Maybe it's because they aren't in play after play. Maybe it's because their role is fairly specialized and seems

simple. (Although, as a Vikings fan, I can tell you that it isn't all that simple and a reliable kicker is someone to never take for granted.) However, if you stuck me out in the middle of a football field and gave me a football and said, "All you have to do is kick this ball through those goalposts," I'm fairly confident that I couldn't do it. It's not as easy as it seems. The mechanics of kicking, the roar of the crowd, the pressure of the moment...I think it would get to me.

So what a funny thing to think about when Bobby Bare asks Jesus to be the kicker and dropkick him through the goalposts of life! First of all, dropkicking sounds a little dangerous and a little unpredictable. You have to get the right connection. You have to have enough power. You have to have enough finesse to get it headed where it needs to go. I'm sure God would say the same thing for us. In order to get us where we're going or maybe even doing what God desires for us, it takes the right connection, enough power, and a little finesse.

Second of all, what does it mean for us to go through the goalposts of life at the Savior's will? Being dropkicked means we don't have a lot of say in where we are going. There is a trust element there. If the football could talk, I imagine it would say, "I just have to trust that the kicker will care for me as he should." Well I guess that's a little bit of jump to presume what a football might say, but I don't think my guess is far off. Trust is a hard thing to do and, admittedly, we aren't the easiest folks to wrangle, but with the right kicker (or guide), I think we can trust we'll make it.

Finally, I love Bobby Bare's plea to "make me a piece in Your master game plan." In the game of football, it's important for the players to know that they are part of a bigger plan, a team working together where all the players have a role. Each has their own way of contributing and it is difficult when one unit is not contributing as they ought to be. And so it is with us. We acknowledge that we are a piece of God's greater story and invite Jesus to use us as He wills to spread His love, share His compassion, and to be His people. We seek God's will for our lives and ask that God might use us for God's glory.

And as funny as it may sound, this is my prayer for us.

May God ever dropkick us through the goalposts of life.

May we be pieces in God's master game plan.

And for the football fans among us, may we all give a little more credit and grace to the kickers out there. Amen.
