
As a newbie here at Christ Lutheran, I have the opportunity to see this place with new eyes. Things that perhaps are all too familiar for you or have lost their novelty

The following Sunday, I stared intently at the windows, as if straining for the mystery message in one of those old "magic eye" books of the 90s. And then, I saw it! A chalice! A baptismal font! A creche! It all seemed to come together in a way that it hadn't the last several weeks that I'd been here. I eagerly shared it with my husband Scott as we worked our way from pane to pane. Really...if you haven't already had the chance, or haven't of recent, I encourage you to take in the beauty, detail and intentionality in these images.





After some research in our church files, thanks Kim Croes, we discovered that these windows were installed in 1980 by Judson Studios, with whom we shared the process of design. Our files indicate that families came together to sponsor different windows as the whole church set out to create something beautiful together. The leadership hoped and trusted that this would enhance their worship life for years to come. And it has! We give thanks for these church planners, visionaries and stewards who helped this dream come to fruition and for which we benefit today.

It's amazing how something can change for you in almost an instant. One day, I didn't see it. And the next, I did.

By the time you read this, Lent is nearly over and Holy Week is likely underway. Easter morning brings a moment where all things change for those early disciples. Their teacher, their friend, their Lord- dead and gone just a few days before, and now, resurrected! Death does not have the final word. Everything has changed as life wins. Saturday, April 20th at 11am, we will host a Celebration of Life service for former members Margaret and Frank Madsen. The service is followed by a luncheon in the social hall.


