Happy Pride, Christ Lutheran! June is a nationally recognized month where we celebrate and lift up

LGBTQ+ Pride and all the varied gifts, experiences, and voices that our LGBTQ+ siblings bring to our world and our communities.

As a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) community, since 2009!, we rejoice in this opportunity to surround our LGBTQ+ siblings with love and support.

Pride Month is also a great time to advocate for the ongoing inclusion, equal opportunity, and justice for the LGBTQ+ community. This involves paying attention- to the issues that matter most to members of this community, inviting others into "the know," and offering our support financially, and in word and deed towards these causes.

So here's something you should know:

On May 1, 2024, the United Methodist General Conference voted to remove the United Methodist Church's ban on the ordination of "self-avowed practicing" LGTBQ+ clergy. And on May 2, 2024, they voted to eliminate in the denomination's Social Principles that "the practice of homosexuality... is incompatible with Christian teaching."

These are historic votes and results to come out of the United Methodist Church and represent a move towards greater support, inclusion, and affirmation of LGBTQ+ individuals of the Methodist denomination. The General Conference would be akin to our Churchwide Assembly and is a meeting of representatives from all the congregations to do the business of the church and make decisions as a denominational body. The decisions out of May 1st and 2nd reportedly overturn long-held positions going back to 1972 and 1984.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), of which our congregation is a part, voted in a similar historical fashion in 2009, where the Churchwide Assembly voted, "to open the ministry of the church to gay and lesbian [now more appropriately, LGBTQ+] pastors and other professional workers living in committed relationships." The 2009 Assembly voted to adopt a new Social Statement, entitled, "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust," which had widespread reflections on sexuality as a whole, including, but not limited to that of LGBTQ+ persons. In addition,

"...the assembly also approved a resolution committing the church to find ways for congregations that choose to do so to 'recognize, support and hold publicly accountable life-long, monogamous, same gender relationships'...The actions here change the church's policy, which previously allowed gays and lesbians into the ordained ministry only if they remained celibate."

As a seminarian in 2009, I remember feeling this impact pretty readily at the seminary as the seminary supported those that were serving in congregations for internships at a time of historic doctrinal change. I remember knowing that this decision was deeply contentious and troubling for some. And still for others was long overdue and in keeping with a Lutheran understanding of the Bible and where God's heart would be.

My heart goes out to the United Methodist Church's members, leadership, and governing bodies as they navigate this important time of transition. I invite you to join me in praying for them, for next steps, for compassion and understanding for one another, and intentionality around welcome, inclusion, and celebration of our LGBTQ+ siblings. And I also invite you to join me in praying for all LGBTQ+ folks and particularly those connected to the Methodist church that they would feel the whole-hearted warmth of their Godly belovedness and the support in word and deed of their siblings of faith.

Mountain Sky Area Bishop Karen Oliveto, the UMC's first openly gay and married bishop, said,

"Today, we celebrate this historic vote," she said. "Tomorrow, we will continue to work together. To learn from one another. To stand with one another. To continue to widen the circle so that those on the margins of church and society can find a home."
